**Dr. Aerin Jacob** is Conservation Scientist at the Yellowstone to Yukon Conservation Initiative based in Canmore, Alberta. Aerin has worked in research, conservation, teaching, and consulting across western North America, East Africa and Central America. She earned a BSc from the University of British Columbia and PhD from McGill University, and conducted postdoctoral research at the University of Victoria. Her science-policy work includes advice to federal, provincial, and Indigenous governments about conservation planning, species at risk, climate change and sustainability, and impact assessment (IA). In 2016, Aerin led an initiative involving >1800 young scientists across Canada to strengthen scientific rigour in IA processes; she continues to work with scientists from government, academia, industry, and the non-profit sector on science in IA and environment-related decisions.

**Prof. Martin Olszynski** joined the Faculty of Law at the University of Calgary in 2013, following several years of public service in environmental and natural resources law and policy. Martin holds a B.Sc. (Biology) and an LL.B., both from the University of Saskatchewan, and an LL.M. (specialization in environmental law) from the University of California at Berkeley. Prior to joining the University of Calgary, he was a part-time professor with the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Law, where he taught environmental law. Martin's primary teaching and research interests are in environmental, natural resources, and water law and policy. He is also interested in the continuous development of related core areas of law, including constitutional, administrative, tort and regulatory law.
