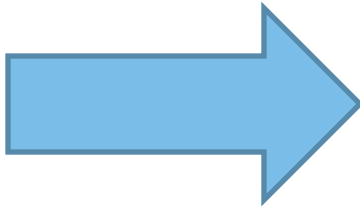
About the ELC

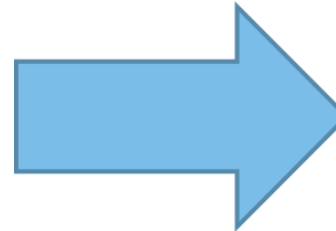
The idea that grew...

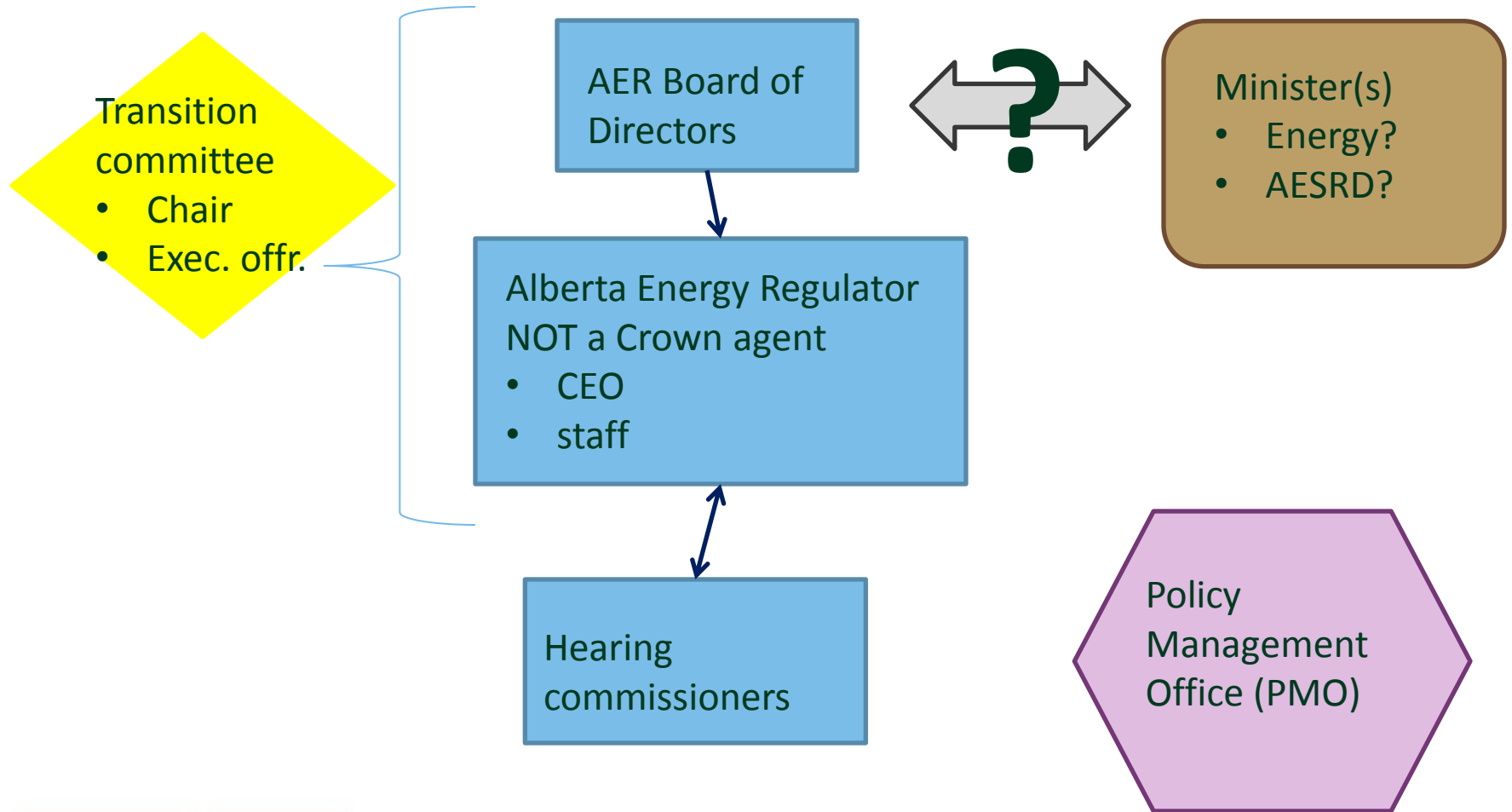
Shift of environmental responsibilities related to energy development under:

- *EPEA*
- *WA*
- *PLA*

Alberta Energy Regulator

- regulate oil, gas, oil sands, coal & pipelines; extraction & potentially processing
- deal with environmental regulatory aspects of energy resource developments
- “public interest” no longer explicitly in mandate

Alberta Energy Regulator structure



Concerns & gaps

- Loss of procedural protections
- Limited transparency, accountability & regulator independence
- Lack of embedded environmental mandate
- No fixes for previous environmental regulatory problems

What the future holds...

- AER operative for June 2013
- Regulations currently under development; 3 anticipated
 - “Boundaries” as between AER & AESRD
 - AER Rules of Practice
 - Process regulation re: applications & participation
